

The International Medical Interpreters Association (IMIA) wins the Inttranet™ Linguists of the Year Award for 2009

Rouen, France (Inttranet): The International Medical Interpreters Association (Also known as IMIA) has won the InttranetTM Linguists of the Year Award for 2009.
