Pre-Conference Arrangements

Your conference experience starts once you finish your registration!

Deduct from the Registration Cost

Did you know that the IMIA offers a \$50 rebate check to anyone who refers a colleague to the event? When they register they need to put your name in the payment notes, and that will tag you for a \$50 rebate check. If you refer several people you might even come cost free and get all your registration paid for!

Some hospitals offer tuition reimbursement. It is worth the call to HR to find out if your position allows it for conferences. If not for the conference perhaps it will pay for the pre-conference educational workshops or the medical terminology workshops, which are educational events. The entire conference offers CEU credits.

Planning Ahead of Time

- Plan what you will be doing at the conference, what important meetings you must attend, make a list
- Go over the workshop list at http://www.imiaweb.org/uploads/pages/682_2..p <u>df</u> and try to outline a tentative workshop itinerary. You don't want to be doing this while you could be networking
- Find out if any of your colleagues are attending, mention getting together, make lunch or dinner dates, time flies by and you will not see them for a while
- Register early to avoid the lines
- Do not forget your ID badge each day; it is required for entry
- Also feel free to plan to take advantage of some attractions and if possible arrive a day early or leave a day late to take advantage of a great vacation destination spot

Safety

It's important to remain vigilant and not leave your belongings unattended. Consider encrypting your laptop and make sure to require a password for your smartphone.
